Aims and objectives

What are your aims and objectives in providing the regulated activities and locations shown in part 3 of this statement of purpose

The Children's Trust provides residential neuro rehabilitation services for children and young people with acquired brain injury up to 18 years of age. In addition we provide a residential service in conjunction with a non maintained school for children and young people with a wide range of complex health needs and disabilities.

Our purpose is to maximise each child's potential and minimise the impact of disability.

Overview Services

Neurorehabilitation Service

The Children's Trust offers a range of residential neuro rehabilitation services for children with acquired brain injury. Children are referred via National Specialised Commissioning or from their Clinical Commissioning group. Rehabilitation is provided by a multidisciplinary team which includes medical staff, therapists, psychology, social work, nursing and care. The team will work in partnership with the child and family to set realistic goals in order to maximise each child's potential. They will also work with the local community teams so they are able to prepare the home and school environment in order to meet the child's needs on discharge.

Step down service

The Children's Trust provides a step down service from hospital to home for children with complex health needs including long term ventilation and tracheostomies. The service aims to support the transition of the child back to a suitable home environment and to work with the family and local teams to develop a package of care to meet the child's identified needs and facilitate positive outcomes.

Short Term Breaks

Residential respite services are provided for children and young people with complex health needs. The service aims to provide residential short breaks for children and families in order that they both enjoy time where the child can be in a safe setting with nursing support for their complex needs.

Residential Services

The Children's Trust aims to provides residential services for up to 52 weeks of the year for children and young people up to 18 years with profound learning disabilities and complex health needs. The service aims to provide:

- High quality of care and therapy whilst supporting the provision of integrated education.
- Deliver care which is individualised and stimulating that encourages every child/young person to achieve their potential
- Provide a holistic approach within an organised, happy, safe environment in which each child's specific social and educational needs can be met

- Work in partnership with parents, carers and other stakeholders enhancing the quality of life for the children
