


Our school mission

Our curriculum


where curriculum and meaningful learning meet

At The Children's Trust School, our curriculum is meaningful, individualised, and at the heart of everything we do. It is shaped by each pupil's Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) and delivered with ambition, creativity, and flexibility. Ofsted described it as "extremely effective" and "highly purposeful."

Our broad, tailored curricula are designed to meet the unique needs of each student, ensuring their learning journey is one of growth and achievement. Dedicated leaders of learning plan and organise each pupil's pathway exceptionally well, enabling them to build knowledge and skills in achievable, yet aspirational steps.

We use thoughtfully selected frameworks such as ImPACTS, DEYO, Sounds of Intent, and Special Yoga to support individual development across all areas.





Enrichment

At The Children's Trust School, we believe learning continues beyond the classroom and school term. Our unique 9-week enrichment programme, delivered outside the standard academic calendar, helps the children we support continue working towards their EHCP targets in fun, creative, and meaningful ways.

Working with our play team and therapy team, the programme offers inclusive experiences such as adapted sports, theatre visits, music, dance, and group activities. These sessions support social interaction, confidence, and enjoyment, while reinforcing key learning and development goals.

Our enriched curriculum also ensures creativity and accessibility are embedded in daily learning. Through accessible art, yoga, sensory play, and music, we provide personalised, engaging experiences that reflect each child's needs and interests.

Together, these opportunities promote not only educational progress, but also well-being, independence, and a strong sense of belonging.





Therapies

At The Children's Trust School, every class has allocated therapists who work in collaboration with our specialist teaching and nursing and care teams to enhance every child's participation and quality of life. The school therapy team includes physiotherapy, speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, music therapy, multi-disciplinary team technicians, as well as a specialist assistive technology team, a health play specialist and play and leisure coordinator and a moving and handling advisor. The therapy team work closely with the team around each child. Individualised therapy is provided for each child as outlined within their education, health and care plan. As well as individualised therapy, the team also offers whole school working, delivering training and support within classrooms and a range of different groups.

Health

The school nurses at The Children's Trust School are involved in assessing new day pupils to ensure their health needs can be safely met. This assessment helps identify any training staff may need before the pupil starts and determines the level of health support required during the school day.

Each pupil is assigned a named nurse who works with families and community health professionals to create a personalised care plan. Health protocols are developed using guidance from specialists, especially for conditions like epilepsy.

The nurse team includes one lead nurse and two school nurses who support pupils and classroom staff with a range of health needs. They train specialist classroom assistants in both general and child-specific clinical skills. The school is equipped to handle medical emergencies with an onsite response team.

The nurse team maintains communication with community health teams to monitor changes and ensure high-quality care.





Transition

Preparing for the future

At The Children's Trust School, we are committed to supporting every young person as they prepare for adulthood. Our transition programme begins early, starting with the Year 9 annual review and continues through to the end of Sixth Form.

Working closely with families, local authorities, and professionals, we ensure each Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) reflects the evolving needs, strengths, and aspirations of the young person. Our dedicated team supports pupils to build the skills and confidence they need for life beyond our school.

We offer a clear transition timeline, regular planning meetings, and events such as our Transition Fairs, which connect families with adult services, providers, and opportunities. We also support families in identifying the right adult placements, offering guidance, visits, and collaborative planning to ensure a smooth and successful move into adult life.

Pupil voice

A celebration of progress and belonging

Harvey joined The Children's Trust School in 2014 at age seven, facing significant sensory sensitivities and challenges with communication. Through a highly personalised, respectful approach, anchored in routine, integrated therapy, and meaningful engagement, Harvey began to flourish.

Now 18 and a valued member of our Sixth Form, Harvey is known across the school for his warmth and captivating smile. He communicates through sensory items, participates in yoga, and enjoys longer periods of eye contact – showing deeper connection with those around him.

One of Harvey's most remarkable milestones has been his progress with eating. Once reliant on a feeding tube, he now enjoys a variety of meals and independently reaches for his favourite snacks, an achievement that reflects his growing independence and quality of life.

Harvey has also developed physical strength, earned a Trinity College music qualification, and learned to express his preferences. His journey is a powerful example of what personalised education, care, and therapy can achieve.





We welcome pupils aged 2 to 19 with profound and multiple learning difficulties (PMLD) and neurodisability, all of whom have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

Our admissions process is designed to ensure that each child's needs can be fully supported within our specialist setting. Applications can be made through local authority professionals using our referral form, which can be downloaded from our website. Once received, referrals are reviewed by our admissions panel to determine suitability and next steps.

We are proud to promote a culture of inclusion, support, and awareness, and are committed to taking positive action in line with the Equality Act 2010 to ensure all children feel welcomed, valued, and safe.


